Application Fee Waiver Request Form

Please complete all fields in order to request a waiver of the £50 application fee for admission in the academic year 2024/25. Completed forms should be submitted via our <u>Contact Form</u> choosing 'Application Fee waiver' as the topic of ticket and put 'Application Fee Waiver Request' in the subject line together with the required supporting evidence attached. A decision will be sent to you directly via email within 10 working days. The decision of the University is final.

Please note:

- To be eligible for an application fee waiver you must have started an application to study, but not submitted it. Waivers will not be issued retrospectively to those who have already submitted their application to study and paid the application fee.
- Application fee waivers must be requested at least 10 working days before any course or funding deadline you wish to meet or by the deadlines stated on our website.
- You must use the same email address for this form that you used to register on the Applicant Portal.
- Application fee waivers will only be applied to courses listed on this form.
- If you are an international applicant from one of the countries listed on our <u>website</u>, you are not required to submit this form as the application fee will be waived automatically for application(s) submission.
